CALIFORNIA FESTIVAL OF SPEED

- **So, this is the Ninth Annual Festival, what's new?**

A: The very experienced Festival Team is bringing back everything that worked well in years past. And, we recognize that while there is significant economic recovery, we have elected to keep nearly ALL OF OUR PRICES THE SAME AS IN 2008 and 2009. This means we have only made small modifications to our registration prices and the hotel prices HAVE NOT GONE UP. We have no control over fuel prices, but who does? If you are able to fill up your gas cans at the local gas stations, you will only pay pump prices.

In addition, the RECESSION SPECIAL available in 09 has been reworked and is now the ECONOMIC STIMULUS PACKAGE. If you select this option, we will delete your event shirt and Saturday dinner and charge you \$25 LESS. If you take advantage of this and register before the prices go up, YOU CAN SAVE A BUNDLE. And still have a great weekend. NOTE THAT YOUR PAYMENT INFORMATION OR PAYMENT CHECK MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE DEADLINE FOR THIS FEATURE! See the website or registration site for details.

Late Fees: If you register for the driving parts of the event BEFORE the Late Fee Deadline of March 5, 2010 AND we receive your payment within 4 days of your registration YOU SAVE MORE \$ BY AVOIDING THE LATE FEE. Late Payment equals LATE FEE. Please understand the reason for this requirement.

*For those registering for the **Time Trial**, Robert Baizer has introduced a "Season Pass" concept. This allows participants to take an additional \$25 off the price of all TTs attended, but you must attend a minimum number of events. Robert has already sent information to the regular TT participants about this. Please contact him for information at prereg@san.rr.com.*

CLUB RACE REGISTRATION

- **How do I register for the PCA Club Race and Enduro at the California Festival of Speed?**

A: PCA Club Racing entrants must register online at <http://register.pca.org> by following the "Click Here to Register for an Event" link. This is the new link for ClubRegistration.net.

***If this is your first time on this site**, click on the "Create Account" link. This prompts you to create a user name and password. If you are invited to click on the "remember me" option, to make the process of signing on again easier, do this. For convenience, WRITE YOUR USER NAME AND PASS WORD DOWN AND FILE IT WITH YOUR "CLUB RACE" STUFF, so you will know where to find it. If you don't use the same sign in data, you will need to create a new account all over again. A real bummer.*

The next step is to enter your personal and car information following the links for these. This does take a little time, but once you have done this, the data will be there for future Club Race registrations and other PCA event registration on the site. You can enter more than one car and later select the correct one for an event..

Be sure to update the ICE (In Case of Emergency) contact info.

THEN follow the "Click Here to Register for an Event" link. Under "Organizations," select PCA. Under "Club," select PCA Zone 8. Then click on Search. Click to select the "California Festival of Speed **Club Race**" option. There is a Time Trial listed there as well. Follow the links; make sure that you select the desired item or quantity that you want. If you don't want a particular item, click on the next field in the box on the right. When you reach the Payment Screen you will see buttons that allow you to unselect items that you have selected, or a "Change Options" button that takes you back through the options again. PayPal is not a payment option for the Festival. **BUT WE DO ACCEPT CREDIT CARDS.** Print the Event Payment screen and mail with your check or fax with your credit card info to the address or fax number on the form. Once you have registered for the Club Race and/or Enduro portion of the event, and made your various selections, you should download the "Club Race Supplementary Registration Form" from the Zone 8 website (<http://www.CalFestival.org>) and click on the "Club Race Supplementary Registration Forms" link. There is a Time Trial equivalent, so select the correct one. The Supplementary Registration Forms are for use by all entrants in the PCA Club Race event to sign up for hotel reservations and provide a driver biography. Event hotel registration is only available by using this form.

- **How can I get help with registering on the PCA Club Race Registration site?**

A: Susan Shire, Club Race Coordinator, has kindly volunteered to assist any Club Race registrant or potential Club Race Registrant who is having any problems registering on the website. Contact her at ClubRace@pca.org or phone: 847-272-7764 during reasonable mid west hours.

- **How do I communicate with the Zone 8 Speed Festival Registrar?**

- **Is there a preferred payment mechanism?**

A: Payment by check is preferred to help us control the costs related to credit cards.

- **To whom do I make my entry check payable?**

A: Make your check payable to "PCA Zone 8".

- **Can I pay by credit card instead of a check?**

A: Yes. <http://register.pca.org> will offer you this option as well. Print the Event Payment screen, and write the card data on the print out. Include the type of card (Visa/MC only), the card number, expiration date, billing address Zip Code and the three digit code from the back of the card. Fax this to the fax number on the Event Payment screen that you printed, or mail it to the address you find there.

- **Will there be early tech/log book inspection?**

A: Yes we will start at the track Thursday at 1:00 p.m. (until approximately 6:00 p.m.)

- **Can I wait until Friday for Club Race tech inspection?**

A: It is highly recommended that you complete all inspections that you can on Thursday to avoid a backlog and possible delays on Friday morning. We will begin on schedule whether you are ready or not and you don't want to lose valuable track time. Remember that Club Race Drivers Meeting attendance is Mandatory.

- **There was a Driver Medical Form in the package last year. What happened to it?**

A: PCA's concerns for the privacy of your medical information as well as Federal laws made the Driver Medical Form that we used in the past no longer needed. We do want the ICE (In Case of Emergency) form that you completed/updated on the registration site. You DID complete/update this didn't you? If you didn't, go back and do it NOW. This form will be provided to the Chief Paramedic on-site for use should you need medical attention. It is a required registration document. This change does NOT change the requirement that you have an up to day Medical

Exam Form on file. For PCA medical requirements/forms see the Club Racing web page: <http://www.pca.org/Activities/ClubRacing.aspx> under the heading "Rules, Licensing & Forms".

- **How will I have my car number assigned?**

A: You will enter/select your car number when you register on line. If your preferred number is already selected, please select another. This is a very good reason to register as soon as Registration opens! Any difficulties with car number selection should be addressed with Susan Shire, PCA Club Racing Program Coordinator, clubrace@pca.org. We plan to post car numbers on the Festival website as soon as the data is available. Look for the "Participants" link under the Z8 Speed Festival link.

- **How is my car class assigned?**

A: You determine your car class from the PCA Rule Book available online at the Club Racing web page: <http://www.pca.org/Activities/ClubRacing.aspx>. You will enter all your car information, including your car class, at the online registration site under the "My Vehicles" link.

- **Did car classes change this year?**

A: No, the "Stock" and "Progressed" Classes had their class letters "flipped" two years ago and other changes happened as well. Other updates have happened this year. Go to the Club Racing web site for more information. This flip means that all Stock Class cars that didn't drive in the last year or so will need new class designations on their cars and the Scruts will need to put a new Class Sticker on your roll cage if they didn't do this last year. This WILL take more time for these volunteer workers to do this. A very good reason to be early to registration. You will not drive until this is attended to.

- **How will I know to which Run Group I am assigned?**

A: We plan to list the run groups on the Festival website, CalFestival.org, as soon as they are assigned. Look for the "Participants" link. This information will also be available on the ClubRegistration.net WEB site at about the same time. Both the event website and the registration site will have updated participant lists with car numbers and, when available, run group assignments. Remember that the Steward may need to make changes to this, even after it is published.

- **Can I rent an AMB transponder for the weekend?**

A: Yes. A transponder MAY be available to reserve from Zone 8. This is intended to be mainly for new Time Trial drivers. Contact the event Registrar for details and to reserve. In addition, only a limited number of AMB Transponders are available for rental from PCA Club Racing Timing personnel at the track. There are no reservations accepted for these rental transponders. To purchase a transponder, please see the Club Racing web page at: <http://www.pca.org/Activities/ClubRacing.aspx> under the heading "Rules, Licensing & Forms". We STRONGLY suggest purchasing a transponder well in advance, because if you don't have a transponder, you won't be timed.

- **Is the charge for a covered garage per day or for the entire weekend?**

A: The garage fee covers the full event, from arrival Thursday after 1:00 p.m. though the end of the event on Sunday. It includes ONE assigned parking slot, most with 50 amp hookups, in the vicinity of the garage. All parking in the garage area is pre-assigned. If you have extra parking needs they need to be addressed elsewhere.

- **Can I get a parking space next to my buddies?**

A: Maybe. In 07, we assigned all parking. Since 2008 we are only assigning Garages, Big Rigs and Big Groups, defined as >6 cars. If you fall into one of these three groups, let the Parking Coordinator know by e-mailing them at Parking@CalFestival.org after everyone in your group has

registered and by March 24, 2010 and we'll make every effort to put you together. One e-mail per group, please. Please contact everyone that you want to park with to get them to register early.

• **Can I pay for a garage when I get to the track?**

A: It is recommended you pay in advance to assure a reserved space, since spots are limited. You will not be permitted to occupy a space until it has been paid for. No pre-pay, no guarantee a space will be available. All garages for this event will be pre-assigned. Contact our Parking Coordinator to have your garage near your friends. You may ask the Registrar at Onsite Check in if a Garage is available. We will try to help you. The onsite price is higher than the pre-reg price.

• **What is the cancellation policy?**

A: After March 29, 2010 all refund requests are subject to a \$100 cancellation fee. Shirt purchases are non-refundable. The Registrar must receive the request by phone, mail, fax or e-mail by April 6, 2010 at noon. Refund requests will be processed following the event and refunds made by check.

• **Why does the entry fee increase after March 10, 2010?**

A: PCA Zone 8 needs to know for planning purposes how many drivers are committed to attending the event. Look at it this way: You can save as much as \$50.00 by having your entry in by March 10. Remember that your payment information or check must be RECEIVED within 4 days of your registration in order to receive the lower price. DO IT NOW.

• **The entry form asks me to choose a shirt size. I forgot to select a size. Can I choose a size at Registration?**

A: No, all shirts are pre ordered from the vendor by the sizes requested. If we don't get a size request, we order XL. If you register after our shirt order deadline, we will try to accommodate your request, but can't guarantee doing so. Register early to prevent this.

• **If I don't like the size of the shirt I selected when I get the shirt, can I trade for a different size?**

A: Yes, but you will need to find another participant to trade with. We won't be able to have extras to accommodate trades.

• **What is the Biography page for? Why should I fill this out?**

A: We expect to have a celebrity race session play-by-play announcer this year. He will use these forms to help with color during the PCA races. Your friends will hear interesting things about you. Too bad you will miss it, being in the car and all. The Biography form is in the Club Race Supplementary Registration package. Please fill it out, print and fax or mail to the Registrar. It will make you sound more interesting. More colorful as it were. And we do not plan to verify any statement that you make. Have fun!

• **I noticed that the entry fee includes the Saturday night dinner. I have other plans that night. Can I register for the event at a lower cost and not attend the dinner?**

A: In the past this was NOT available, but last year we introduced the RECESSION SPECIAL. This allowed you to can select the "Recession Special" and save \$25. This year we are calling this the Economic Stimulus Package. The deal is the same: Select this when you register (by March 5), and you will reduce your entry fee by \$25 and you will not receive the event shirt or the dinner. Note that this offer EXPIRES the same day as the early registration price expires, March 5, 2010. And, just like the early registration price, we must receive your check or valid payment information by four days after your registration. Or you will not receive the Economic Stimulus Package. In addition, as an additional help ALMOST ALL EVENT REGISTRATION COSTS AND THE EVENT HOTEL ARE THE SAME PRICE AS LAST YEAR.

• **I am a Club Racer and have a PCA-qualified personal instructor with me. Can s/he instruct me in the car during practice starts and other pre-race sessions?**

A: No, only the driver is permitted in the car during any PCA Club Racing activity including practice and warm-up sessions as well as the SPRINT RACE and ENDURO sessions. However, you could sign up for the Zone 8 Time Trial event, understanding you are not "racing" in these sessions and must obey TT passing restrictions. Your instructor can ride with you during Time Trial sessions, but the instructor must be approved by the Zone 8 Chief Driving Instructor in advance. He can be reached at pdyoung@cox.net. Since your car has a 5/6-point harness and race seat for the driver, Time Trial rules require equal restraints for your instructor as well.

- **I am driving in the Club Race, but I'd like to run in the Time Trial timed run session as well, so I can get points for the Time Trial series. Is that possible?**

A: Yes. You should register for this on the <http://register.pca.org> website when you are registering for the Club Race. You can go back later and add this, if you forgot to register for it initially. Do not forget to pay for it if you have already sent in your payment. Note that you will NOT be allowed to run the Time Trial practice sessions, but will be allowed to run in the timed run session on Sunday afternoon.

- **What insurance coverage is provided for the event?**

A: Liability insurance is provided by PCA's traditional insurer for the event's Club Racing, Time Trial, and Concours events. A copy of the Certificate of Insurance will be posted in the Credentials Building. This insurance does NOT cover damage to your car or damage that YOU cause to the facility or other cars. You are responsible for this. Please see the PCA website (www.pca.org) and go to the Insurance page for more information. **Please check with your car insurance to verify what coverage that it provides, if any.**

PCA CLUB RACE LICENSING

- **Where can I find copies of the required PCA forms and Club Racing rules?**

A: You can download the 2010 Schedule, Rules and copies of all necessary forms at the PCA Club Racing website at <http://www.pca.org/Activities/ClubRacing.aspx>. There is a wealth of information about PCA Club Racing on this site.

- **How can I reach the PCA Club Racing Program Coordinator with a specific licensing question?**

A: Susan Shire, PCA Club Racing Program Coordinator can be reached at ClubRace@pca.org or phone: 847-272-7764 and fax: 847-272-7785. Please handle this well in advance of the event.

- **I hold a current NASA, SCCA or POC Competition License. Do I need a PCA Racing License to compete?**

A: Yes. Please see the 2010 PCA Club Racing Rule book on the PCA Club Racing web page at <http://www.pca.org/Activities/ClubRacing.aspx> for licensing requirements or contact Susan Shire at the addresses listed above. You may be eligible for a Provisional License.

- **I have a Rookie/Provisional license and raced in last year's California Festival of Speed event in Fontana. How do I know if I must attend the Orientation Meeting Thursday evening at the track?**

A: If you are required to attend the Orientation Meeting, you will be notified by the Event Registrar or the PCA Club Racing National Steward or the PCA Club Racing Coordinator. If you are not sure, contact the PCA Club Racing Coordinator at the above contact information. If you are notified, it is a MANDATORY meeting for you and you can't race if you miss it! Thursday, 6:30 p.m. in the Drivers Meeting Room. Don't be late. If you are not sure, contact Susan Shire for the definitive

answer. Guests are welcome at this meeting. If you have any problem complying with this, contact Susan Shire immediately.

- **I will be a co-driver for the 1-hour Enduro only. Do I need a PCA Racing License?**

A: Yes, all drivers and co-drivers must meet all PCA Club Racing requirements and submit both the Driver Medical Form and complete the online Club Race registration at <http://register.pca.org> and submit the \$120.00 payment for each co-driver. Please see the 2010 PCA Club Racing Rule book on the PCA Club Racing web page at <http://www.pca.org/Activities/ClubRacing.aspx> for licensing requirements or contact Susan Shire at the addresses listed above.

- **My PCA Club Racing medical has expired. When must I have a new one on file?**

A: You must have a current medical on file in the PCA Club Racing Office in order to complete registration at the track. Contact Susan Shire at the addresses listed above with any questions regarding your PCA Club Racing medical form. Take care of this now.

- **My PCA Competition License has expired. How do I renew?**

A: The 2010 PCA Club Racing License renewal form is available on the PCA Club Racing web page at <http://www.pca.org/Activities/ClubRacing.aspx> or contact Susan Shire at the addresses listed above. The rules are firm: No CURRENT PCA membership, no CURRENT license, no CURRENT Medical, NO RACING! Be prepared to present your current PCA Club Racing License and a photo ID at registration.

TIME TRIAL REGISTRATION

- **Is a Time Trial considered “Racing”?**

A: Emphatically, NO, this is a safety-conscious, high-performance driving event with instruction by experienced PCA Instructors, many of them holding PCA National DE instructor certification, available.

- **What are the requirements to participate in the Time Trial?**

A: If you are a Student, you must have completed eight autocrosses or equivalent over a period of at least 9 months, but not more than 18 months prior to the Speed Festival. If you are a Driver or Instructor, you must have a Zone 8 Competition Permit. These are available for an annual fee of \$10 from Paul Young at pdyoung@cox.net. The requirements for 5-point harnesses and other safety equipment have changed. Cars in S/S and S classes are no longer required to have 5-point harnesses, or fire bottles but they are still strongly encouraged. Novice drivers must have the same restrains for the instructor that the driver has. For example, if you have a 5-point harness for the driver, you need similar equipment for the Instructor riding with you. Participants must have a Snell 2000 or newer helmet. All cars classed higher than S/S or S need a securely mounted fire extinguisher. Long sleeves and long pants are required. Driving Gloves and a neck brace are encouraged. See the Rules for details. Novice drivers need a Zone 8 Log Book which is available from Paul Young, Zone CDI. Your car must pass tech inspection. Pre-tech is highly recommended. The pre-tech form can be downloaded on the Festival website, CalFestival.org For more information, contact Jack Miller, Time Trial Chair, at tt@pcasdr.org.

- **How do I register for the Time Trial?**

A: Go to the registration website, which is the same site as the Club Race registration. NOTE that this is NOT the registration website used for other Zone 8 and San Diego Region Time Trial events! Follow the directions above in the Club Race Registration section, and when you get to the “select an event” section, select the “California Festival of Speed Time Trial” option. Follow the onscreen prompts. Please review the directions for payment options etc. You will need to enter your car and personal information if you have not done this before. If you have entered it before, please review it to be sure it is still correct. Please enter the In Case of Emergency (ICE) information.

- **Can I do my Time Trial tech inspection at the track?**

A: Yes, but expect significant delays. You are MUCH better off pre-tech'ing between March 24 and

April 6, but after your last event prior to the Speed Festival, at an authorized tech station. Please contact John Rickard at Black Forest, Phone: 858-292-1192 for locations and information. After you have a signed tech form, fax it to the Event Registrar, Fax: 619-287-6591, and stick it in your glove compartment. This will save you tons of time and hassle.

Please note that it is your responsibility to bring a safe and rules compliant car to pre tech inspection and to the track.

Please check the 2010 rules on the Zone 8 website to see if any changes apply to your car.

- **I am driving in the Club Race, but I'd like to run in the Time Trial timed run session so I can get points for the Time Trial Series. Is that possible?**

A: Yes. You should register for this on the <http://register.pca.org> website when you are registering for the Club Race. You can go back later and add this, if you forgot to register for it initially. Do not forget to pay for it if you have already sent in your payment. Note that you will not be allowed to run in the Time Trial practice sessions, but will be allowed to run in the timed run sessions on Sunday afternoon.

- **Is this a Spectator Event?**

A: Under our rules, NO. While we are inviting all Porsche enthusiasts to attend the event, all will be treated as "Participants," meaning that all folks entering the infield will need to read and sign all appropriate insurance waivers and wear an armband to signify this.

- **What insurance coverage is provided for the event?**

A: Liability insurance is provided by PCA's traditional insurer for the event's Club Racing, Time Trial, and Concours. A copy of the Certificate of Insurance will be posted in the Credentials Building. This insurance does NOT cover damage to your car or damage that YOU cause to the facility or other cars. You are responsible for this. Please see the PCA website (www.pca.org) and go to the Insurance page for more information. **Please check with your car insurance to verify what coverage that it provides, if any.**

- **Where is lost and Found?**

A: For items lost ON THE TRACK, go to the Tech Shed next to the drivers meeting room.

For items lost elsewhere at the Speedway, go to the Hospitality Tent. Please take any found items there.

For Hotel lost and found, ask at the front desk.

CALIFORNIA SPEEDWAY FACILITIES

- **Can I bring my pet to the event?**

A: No, the Speedway prohibits pets anywhere on the premises. Please don't risk the embarrassment to yourself or making problems for the event organizers by violating this rule.

- **Can I use tape to put up signs, schedules and other notices in my pit and garage area or in the rest rooms?**

A: Generally NO, because the Speedway contract requires that we discourage all use of tape on Speedway property, and penalizes Zone 8 if it is not removed.

So, IF YOU USE TAPE, PLEASE USE THE EASY TO REMOVE VARIETY AND BE SURE TO REMOVE IT COMPLETELY WHEN YOU LEAVE.

- **Will there be an FM radio station repeating the PA announcer this year? Last year this was hard to hear.**

A: Yes, and we will have the radio frequency information in your registration packet when you

arrive. PLEASE bring an FM radio to have on in your pits area to hear the PA announcements along with any power cords to plug it in.

- **Is overnight camping permitted in the infield?**

A: Yes, by pre-registration. Permanent rest rooms with showers are available. The cost is \$40 per occupied vehicle per night to cover the cost of the added security required. Limited late in and out is available to campers only. The Speedway prohibits pets anywhere on the premises.

- **When can I put my car in the infield?**

A: Thursday, April 8, 2010 after 1:00 p.m., AFTER you have first registered at the Credentials Building.

- **Is all participant parking assigned like previously?**

A: No, as established two years ago, we are not assigning all participant parking. We need to assign Garages, and it is best for us to assign Big Rigs. Upon request we will reserve parking for Big Groups, which we define as more than 6 cars. Big Rig and Big Group parking needs must be communicated with our parking Coordinator at Parking@CalFestival.org well in advance. This data must be submitted by March 24, 2010.

- **I'll be in town a week early. Can I leave my car/trailer in a secure area?**

A: We are sorry, but, no. In the past we were able to accommodate this request, but changes at the Speedway no longer make this possible.

- **Is there room in the infield for my transporter?**

A: Yes, the registration fee for each driver includes an approximate 11' x 50' space. If you require something larger, please contact our Parking Coordinator at Parking@CalFestival.org.

- **What fuels will be available at the track?**

A: 110 octane leaded race fuel as well as 100 octane unleaded race fuel and 92 octane unleaded fuel is available at the Speedway. Note that in previous years, the pump nozzle for race fuel did not fit into stock cars that have an "unleaded" fuel restrictor. The 92 octane fuel nozzle should fit your stock car. You may wish to bring your own funnel to speed the fueling process. Cash and checks are accepted. You may open an "account" for the weekend by leaving a blank signed check with the manager of the fuel station. You can either pay this with cash at the end of the weekend, or they will fill in the amount and deposit the check. THE FUEL IS MORE EXPENSIVE THAN AT A REGULAR FILLING STATION. Credit Cards are NOT ACCEPTED. There are regular filling stations near the Speedway, on Cherry Ave near the freeway.

- **Will there be a tire vendor at the track?**

A: Yes, but none have confirmed yet. We expect to see Pirelli this year. Previously we had:

- **I am going to overnight in the infield. Is it okay to drive a car around the road course in the evening to become familiar with the track?**

A: Absolutely not! Because of insurance and safety concerns no one (except Speedway staff) is allowed to drive on the track outside of regularly scheduled activities. Violation will result in disqualification for the weekend and forfeit of all fees submitted. It could result in us losing the ability to rent the track in the future.

- **When does the track open on Friday, Saturday and Sunday morning?**

A: The track will open at 6:00 a.m. each day. You will use the entrance directly off of Cherry Avenue.

- **What are the requirements for attendees under 18 years of age?**

A: PCA National insurance regulations, as well as Speedway regulations, require that both the under 18 years old attendee (anyone entering the facility site) and one of their parents sign the insurance waiver the first time that they enter the facility for this event. We must enforce this regulation. In addition, the regulations prohibit those under 18 from entering the grid and hot pit area. We must enforce this as well.

HOTEL

- **Is there an event hotel?**

A: Yes, the Sheraton Suites Fairplex. It is about a 20 minute drive from the Speedway, and convenient to the Ontario Airport. The hotel is located at 601 West McKinley Ave, Pomona, CA 91768. Note: THIS HOTEL IS ALL SUITES and non smoking.

- **Is there a special hotel rate? Verify dates**

A: Yes, the special rate of \$99/night including a full breakfast buffet for up to two persons per room (a big plus not available elsewhere), and preferred placement in the hotel is available prior to March 18. After March 17 but by March 31, the price goes up to \$115/night and the preferred placement goes away. 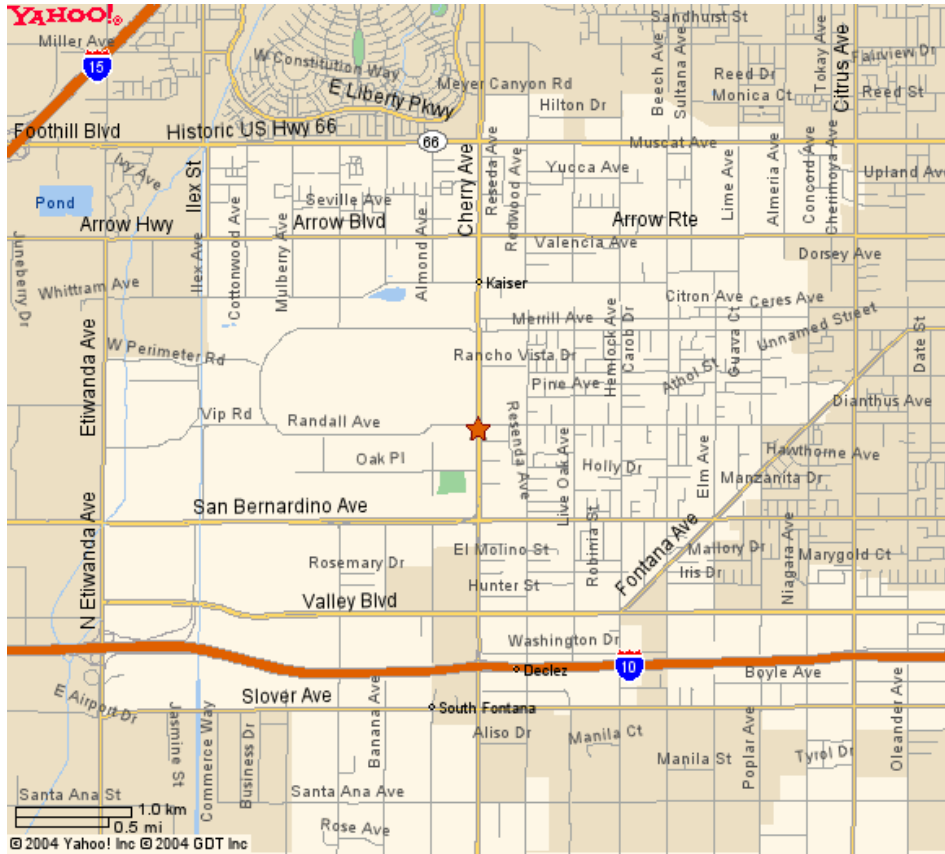
